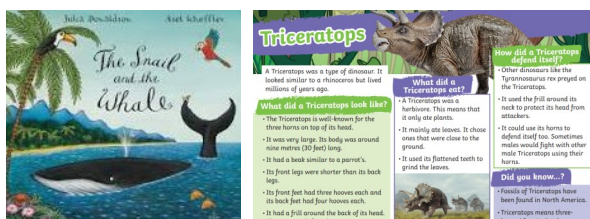
Topic—Would you have a dinosaur as a pet?

Dinosaurs are amazing! We will be linking much of our learning into Dinosaurs, the history of fossil discovery, Mary Anning, and modern day David Attenborough. We will be looking at the science behind animal bones and structure, what they eat, and writing fact files about them.

English

This half term we are starting off with *The Snail and the Whale* by Julia Donaldson. We will be focusing on descriptive language and how to write an interesting story setting. You can help your child by asking them to describe locations to you, using all their senses.

We will be looking at fact files about dinosaurs and producing some factual writing about them.

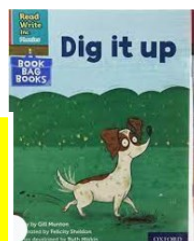
Reading/Phonics

Your child has just been assessed to ensure that they are in the correct phonics group. In their reading record, you will see an insert with the "tricky" or "red" words that they will be learning to read by sight in their phonics groups. These words are not easily decodable using phonics rules. They will bring home a Read Write Inc reading book which is targeted at their ability level; they should be able to decode and read all the words in these books. Every week, your child will also bring home a sharing book. This may not be at their phonics level and is a sharing book to read with an adult. They will also bring home a library book, completely of their choice.

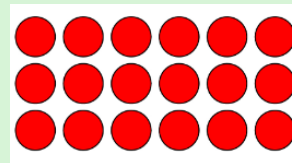
Maths

In Maths we will be learning about the basics of multiplication and division. We will continue to skip count in 2s, 5s and 10s and add equal groups using arrays to solve grouping and sharing problems.

We will also begin to learn about fractions, finding a half and a quarter of a shape or an amount.

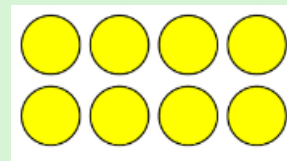
At the end of this half term we will be learning about position and direction. Describing turns, using 'left', 'right', 'above' and 'below'. We will also learn how to use ordinal numbers.

$$6 \times 3 =$$

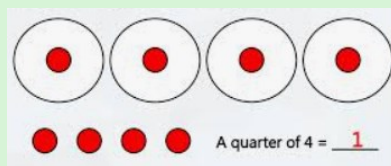
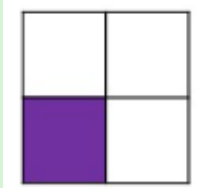

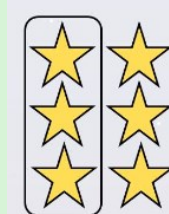
$$4 \times 2 =$$

Finding half and a quarter of an amount



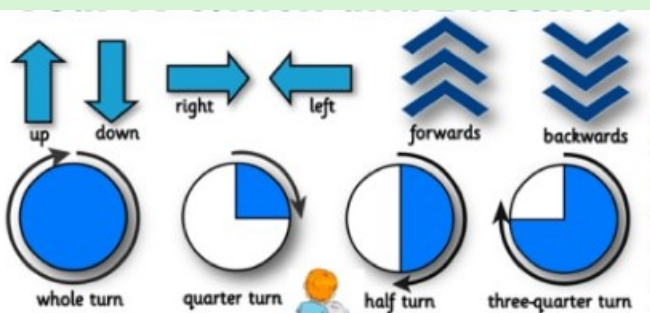

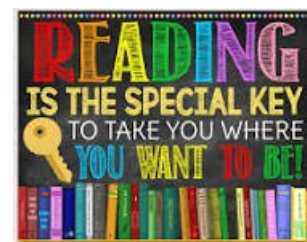
